BACKGROUND

Mzumbe University was established by the Mzumbe University Charter, 2007 enacted under Section 25 of the Universities Act, 2005 (Act No. 7 of 2005) which repealed and replaced the Mzumbe University Act, 2001 (Act No. 21 of 2001). As a Training Institute, the University boasts of over 50 years' experience of training in the public administration, Business management, accountancy, finance, management, science and Technology Health system management and good governance. Mzumbe University's origin can be traced back to 1953 when the British Colonial Administration established a Local Government School in the country. The school was aimed at training local Chiefs, Native Authority Staff, and Councilors. The level of training was elevated after Tanzania's (Tanganyika) independence to include training of Central Government Officials, Rural Development Officers and Local Court Magistrates.

The pronouncement of Arusha Declaration in 1967, which culminated in the nationalization of private businesses and the decentralization process of 1971, created a huge demand for high and middle level human resources. As one of the Government strategies to meet this demand, in 1972, the then Local Government School was amalgamated by the then Institute of Public Administration of the University of Dar es Salaam to form the Institute of Development Management (IDM-Mzumbe). IDM was a higher learning institution for training professional managers in the public and private sectors.

Given the natural growth of the Institute over the years of successful operation and the changing national and international human resource needs, the Government transformed it into a fully-fledged public University. This was made through the Act of Parliament No. 21 of 2001 (the Mzumbe University Act, 2001). Currently, the Mzumbe University is governed by the Mzumbe University Charter, 2007 which now guides the operations and management of the University. The mandate of the University as stipulated in the Mzumbe University Charter, 2007 focuses on training and research.

Mzumbe University (MU) is a public university established by the Mzumbe University Charter, 2007 enacted under Section 25 of the Universities Act, 2005 (Act No. 7 of 2005) which repealed and replaced the Mzumbe University Act, 2001 (Act No. 21 of 2001).

The University is a fully accredited institution by the Tanzania Commission for Universities. It has been chartered since 2007 in accordance with the Universities Act No.7 of 2005. The mandate of the University as stipulated in the Mzumbe University Charter, 2007 focuses on training, research, consultancy and outreach services

LOCATION

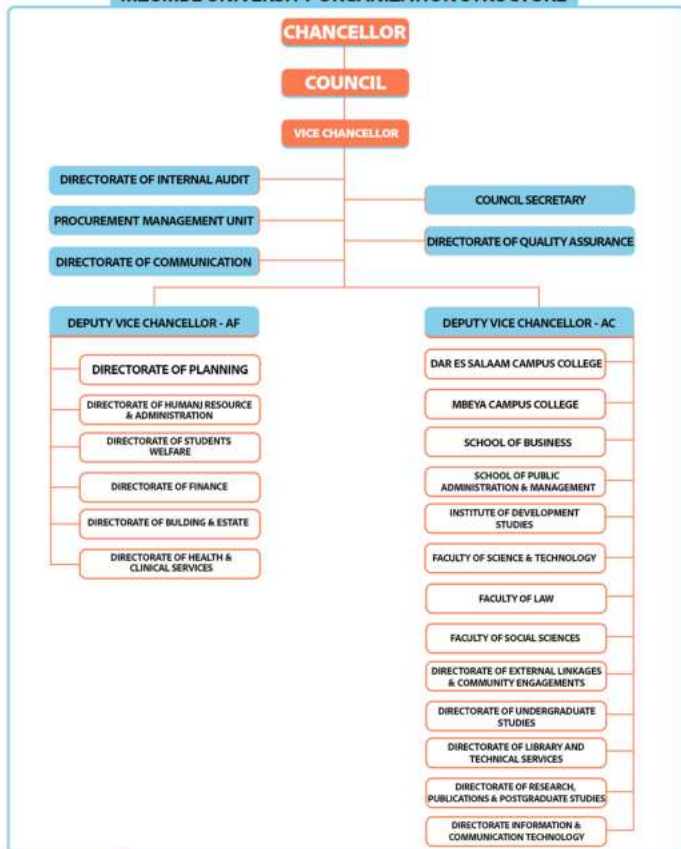
The University's Main Campus is located 20 km South-West of Morogoro Municipal Centre, about 3.5 km off the Dar es Salaam – Zambia Highway. It is about 220 km away from Dar es Salaam and within an hour's drive to the Mikumi National Park. The University is situated at the foothills of the Uluguru Mountain ranges on the Eastern arc of Udzungwa range, shares a common border with Mzumbe Secondary School on the East. The University has two campus colleges, one in Dar es Salaam and the other in Mbeya. The Dar es Salaam Campus College is located in Upanga area, Olympio Street and Tegeta center. The Mbeya Campus College is located in the Mbeya City, Forest Area at a walking distance of 300 metres from the Dar es Salaam – Zambia Highway.



ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS

The University consists of twelve (12) academic units which are two Campus Colleges, two Schools, three Faculties, one Institute and four Academic Directorates. It also has ten (10) administrative units as shown in the following drawings;

PROGRAMMES OFFERED AT MZUMBE UNIVERSITY

The University offers both undergraduate and postgraduate programmes as follows; Thirty (30) Bachelor Degree Programmes offered at the Main Campus Morogoro, four (04) Bachelor Degree Programmes at Mbeya Campus College and two (02) Bachelor Degree Programmes at Dar es Salaam Campus College. It also offers Seven (07) Diploma and Eight (08) Certificate Programmes.

On postgraduate programmes the University offers thirty eight (38) programmes where by twenty seven are offered at Main Campus, ten (10) at Dar es Salaam Campus College and one (01) is offered at Mbeya Campus College.

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LIBRARY SERVICES

Mzumbe university is having a state of the art libraries across all it's campuses that support Teaching, Learning, Consultancy, and Research and Outreach services at the University. The library has capacity of accommodating 750 readers at a time, with 19 study carrels for readers who want private silent reading.

The Library contains one of the best and up-to-date stock of print book collections in the fields offered by the university. The collection comprises of about 41,000 book volumes for all three campuses in Morogoro, Mbeya and Dar es Salaam.

The print book collection bibliographic information can be accessed online through the Library's Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) at library.mzumbe.ac.tz/iah.

Currently, there are about sixteen (16) databases that provide accessible e-books, e-journal articles, e-cases and e-book chapters.



ACCOMMODATION SERVICES

Student's accommodation service at the Mzumbe University is coordinated by the directorate of welfare in the Department of Accommodation. The University possess a number of hostels under its campuses; Dar es salaam Campus College (DCC) and Mbeya Campus (MCC) for both undergraduate and postgraduate students.

The hostels have rooms of different sizes and facilities; therefore they differ in capacity of accommodating students. There are rooms which can accommodate 2, 4, 6 and 8 for undergraduate students. On the other hand, there are single rooms for postgraduate students. The overall accommodation capacities of the University Students are allocated for room spaces after applying for the on-campus accommodation in consideration of criteria for allocating accommodation as per the Mzumbe University Students' Accommodation and its guidelines.



The rooms in the University hostel are furnished with beds, mattresses, tables and chairs. Students are not allowed to remove fittings from the rooms and they are responsible for the proper care of all properties found in the rooms. Any damage or loss must be reported immediately to the Warden. The Students By- Laws and Students Accommodation policy and guidelines stipulate all accommodation disciplinary offences.

Students who are accommodated in the university hostels pay accommodation fees at an authorized rate. Students with Special Needs have their rooms which are well modified to accommodate their needs.

For Dar es Salaam Campus college Tegeta center the university has an MoU with nearby private hostels. The list of private hostels and the contacts are normally attached with the admission letters.

CATERING SERVICES

The Mzumbe University has cafeteria which offers catering services to students and staff at subsidized rates. The meals are paid for at the cafeteria counters. There are Four (4) cafeterias at Mzumbe Main Campus which are known as OLD Cafeteria, MUSO, IDM and Maekani Cafeteria, MUSSO and IDM on the main campus which have the capacity to serve the present student population. Catering services can be offered by the service providers to conference and seminar participants on cash basis upon special arrangements. Students are not allowed to cook in halls of residences and therefore are advised to use the catering services approved by the university.



MEDICAL SERVICES

The University has a Health Centre at the Main Campus and dispensary at MCC that provides clinical and health services fully. The facilities are having full-time staff to attend the students and the university staff as well as neighboring community.

GAMES AND SPORTS

Across its all campuses, the University has facilities for outdoor and indoor games such as football, basketball, netball, tennis, table tennis, tug of war, volleyball and badminton.

The University is affiliated to local and international sports organizations such as Tanzania Universities Sports Association (TUSA), East Africa Universities Sports Federation (EAUSF). Through TUSA the University is affiliated with the Federation of African University Sports (FASU) and the Federation of International University Sports (FISU). The University participates in National and International sports competitions. Therefore, all students are expected and encouraged to come sports outfits.



THE UNIVERSITY BOOKSHOP AND STATIONERY SERVICES

The University operates a bookshop, whose major function is to sell to the students and general public textbooks, stationery and a wide range of selections of background reading materials. The bookshop is open from 8.00 to 15.00 hours from Mondays to Fridays. However, there are other business people offering stationary services nearby the university

POSTAL AND BANKING SERVICES

At the Main Campus, there is a Post Office at the Mzumbe University which provides all the normal postal services and three banks that offer services. The banks are CRDB and NMB which have the branches at Mzumbe University which provides all normal banking services. The National Bank of Commerce (NBC) has Automated Teller Machines (ATM) to provide teller services.

RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES

Religious facilities and services are available on campus for various Christians and Muslim denominations. Protestants have a Chaplain appointed by the Christian Council of Tanzania (CCT), and Catholics get spiritual services from Mzumbe Catholic Parish. Muslim Students' Association at Mzumbe caters for the interests of the Muslim Students' Community



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
